



Day 19 -Getting to the Point

“This is what the Lord says: ‘Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good way is, and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls’.” (Jeremiah 6:16)

What happens when we align our plans with God’s will? In math when you have two lines, they can be parallel or they can intersect. Parallel lines, by definition never meet. Even though the lines go on forever in both directions they will never meet. However, if one of the lines will shift its position or tilt even slightly, it will eventually cross the other line or intersect it. The location at which these two lines meet creates a point that is common to both lines. God is calling us to a common point or a place in which our plans and desires come into alignment with His will and His plans. Moreover, if we were to place one line running north to south and the other running east to west, at the place of that intersection something unique happens - a **right** angle is formed. So if God is upright, and He is, when we lay down before Him, we are in right alignment with Him. Jeremiah 6:16 says “This is what the Lord says: ‘Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good way is, and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls’.” So, when we need to make decisions, we can always stop and ask God, “where is the ancient path and the good way?” Then we must be willing to walk in it. It is then that He can shoot us, like an arrow, into our destiny.
